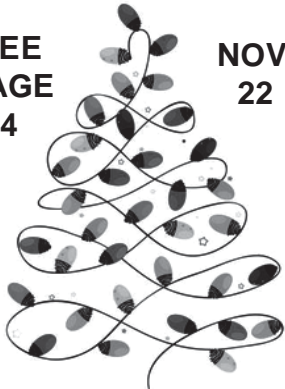

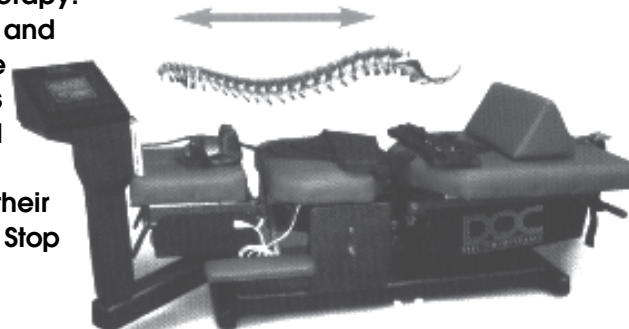

There is no local radio station catering to this demographic within our community. In response to this, Faith Baptist lead the way by encouraging the evangelical community on the island to partner together & establish a full powered FM radio station.

In the winter of 2019/2020 this dream will be fully realized with the launch of Praise FM on the frequency of 90.7 FM across the entire Cape Breton Regional Municipality!

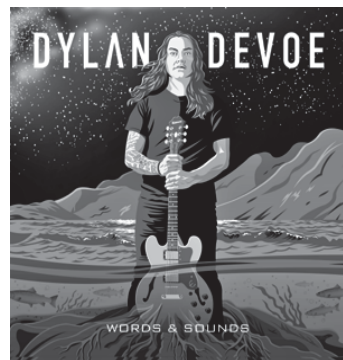

Back in January I wrote some words about the new album from Dylan Devoe's band Pirate Jenny-and now here's Dylan's first solo album "**Words and Sounds**". I first heard a preview of the song "The Battle of Louisbourg" on local radio and was super impressed. Complete with relevant sound effects this historically themed tune may be the first about the siege of Louisbourg, and Dylan was inspired by his daily drive to Louisbourg to record the album. He spent time at the fortress researching for the song and actually had Michael Spawn (an interpreter at the fortress) play the marching snare on the track, and did continual marching up and down a wooden staircase at Broken Clock recording studios to simulate an army on the move. As for some of the other songs here, "Caper Run" has a romping-stomping groove with a message we can all relate to-and "The Island" will touch the hearts of Capers far and wide. I really liked the needle drop sound at the start of "Words and Sounds"; this number is deep and expansive with nice backing vocals by Colette Deveaux. "Barfly" sounds like something George Thorogood might do and "Piece of West Virginia" really reminds me of the music of The Grapes of Wrath and the Northern Pikes, and "Free" has a nice relaxed 'summer at the beach' vibe to



it-and "Never Look Back" is an uptempo stomper that has a real power pop meets country feel. It would be unfair, and inaccurate to describe Dylan's music as Celtic or folk-it's so much more than that. Actually I can't place him in one genre; a perfect example of that is the song "Voodoo Queen of New Orleans" that starts out as a meandering, slithering tune that falls into madness at the end. It is a really impressive number. The album closes off with the introspective haunting of "Witches and Gypsies"-a song that feels and sounds intimate and personal. Dylan was backed up by Colin Grant, Jordan Musycsyn, Colette Deveaux, Redmond MacDougall, Travis Morrison, Jennie McKibbon, Chuck Knott and Tyler MacDonald. The official album release takes place this Saturday at the Cedars Club in Sydney-with Dylan and the Dirty Dogs, Jordan Musycsyn and the Colette Deveaux band. Showtime is 8p.m. The CD is available at Atomic Records in Sydney River, Duke's Place in Sydney Mines and on Spotify & AppleMusic.

Community Update on Invictus - Exploring Hope and Agency on the Northside

THE RESEARCH - In the Invictus research project we set out to explore the state of hope and agency on the Northside. Over the course of two years, the project team designed and implemented a series of research tools. Ultimately, 502 Northsiders participated in a community survey and 41 individuals took part in in-depth interviews.

We recognize and extend our great appreciation to the people who stepped forward and trusted us in sharing their experiences, through interviews and surveys. We will make every effort to employ this information wisely and respectfully. Additionally, we extend warmest thanks to everyone else who contributed to this work: supportive community members, members of our Data Working Group, participants in the resident review panels, and the researchers who carried out the work, Dr. Ed Michalik, Samantha Lowes, Lilla Roy and the late Dr. Margaret Dechman.

DATA SHARING EVENT - On October 26 and 27 researcher Dr. Ed Michalik delivered his interpretation of the data. The initial presentation of the data was live streamed to ensure all the community members who wished to participate could. Following the events, the videos were removed, in order to prepare an archival version of each. When they were removed, we did not clearly communicate why that was happening, and that has led to confusion. We apologize for this.

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING - Northside Rising shares Northsiders' commitment to working together for a more hopeful, healthy, just community. The Invictus research points to a few key indicators of the state of the community around hope, agency, and trust. Northside Rising intends to continue exploring these themes as levers for bringing about the change we want to see.

A FEW KEY FINDINGS FROM THE RESEARCH - Northsiders express a strong love for their community: 92% of survey respondents said the Northside is a good place to live and 89% said that other community members will help you if you need it.

The overall level of hope on the Northside is moderate to low. On average Northsiders scored 35 out of a possible 48 points on the scale used to measure hope. 36 is considered moderate.

Some parts of the community have significantly lower levels of hope than others. In particular, Northsiders experiencing economic hardships have dramatically lower levels of hope than other community members. People who indicated they 'never have enough to get by' scored 25.8 on the hope scale. 30 is considered low.

Substance Use is a priority issue for Northside Rising. In order to better understand the impacts of this issue on the community, 'people who use drugs' were included as one of the target research groups for this study. Data from the survey showed that substance use impacted 85% of all respondents - either themselves, a spouse/partner, or another family member is a person with lived or living experience with substance use.

The research also examined trust, a key ingredient enabling people to work together to achieve community goals. Overall levels of trust on the Northside were found to be relatively low among community members in general and in relation to various institutions and professions. Institutional trust was particularly low among some community members, especially for the research target group, 'people who use drugs'.

WHAT'S NEXT: - We are looking at ways to share and further explore key findings of the research. Initially, this will include a webpage, with video excerpts, some analysis, and points for discussion. We look forward to continuing to participate in conversations around hope, agency and trust in the community. Our hope is that in providing this research for community use, we can all make use of it in our respective and collective work towards positive change in the community.

The distressing tone of Invictus discussions has motivated the Northside Community Coalition to host an event that aims to build on the hope in the community. Stay tuned for details on "Pockets of Change", a storytelling gathering happening the evening of December 9th.

The last lines of Invictus, the poem, are a ringing call to action, "I am the master of my fate, I am the captain of my soul." Northside Rising believes in the power of community, and we continue to strive to get behind the hope, agency, trust and love on the Northside.
