CBRM DEADLINE EXTENDED

The deadline has been extended to January 31 for applications for the Municipal Low Income Property Tax rebate. The rebate program provides a maximum yearly tax reduction of \$225.

Applicants must reside in CBRM and have legal title to the property and it must be assessed in their name. The property must be their primary residence and not a seasonal residence, vacation home or income property.

Total household income must be less than the maximum income threshold as stipulated by the Guaranteed Income Supplement Program. For the 2020 taxation year, that maximum was \$25,104.


Municipal planning department services and taxation and utility payment services are available during the current closure of City Hall at 320 Esplanade in Sydney.

Take 2 OURECTOR WITH PAUL POWER

Yes, I know it's 2022 but I'm looking back at something that was released in December on HBO Max. "Santa Inc." is a stop-motion animation series, but is it definitely NOT for kids. I heard about the show just before it first aired and once I knew that Seth Rogen was involved I was on my way to the North Pole-well, as a viewer anyway. The story follows 'Candy Smalls' (voiced by the multi-talented comedian, actor and writer Sarah Silverman) a female elf who's second-incommand at the North Pole. and she wants to become the first female Santa Claus when the jolly old dude retires. Cue Seth Rogen as probably the most politically incorrect Santa Claus you could imagine. Again folks, this show is not for kids, or the 'snowflakes' out there. Also helping out is Craig Robinson as 'Junior', the jacked up lead reindeer. The first season shows the build-up to the big night with all the backstabbing, scheming, drug and alcohol abuse and general chaos befitting a crass Christmas. This series looks amazing-with vibrant colours that really push the holiday magic over the top, and there are tons of visual jokes. However, the series has been called one of the worst seasonal offerings to date, eliciting a lot of online anger. Mira Fox of the Jewish digital magazine 'The Forward' said "You might think that this Christmas series made by two famous Jews



would have some greater message about antisemitism or Christianity's hegemony in the U.S. but instead Silverman, too, has reduced Jewishness to a handful of hackneyed stereotypes in 'Santa, Inc.'...ouch. There were also over 200,000 dislikes on YouTube, including some antisemitic & Holocaust denial jokes. However, HBO Max defended the trailer and disabled the comments due to its controversies. Seth Rogen claimed that the series was being 'review bombed' by tens of thousands of white supremacists. In today's 'digital snowflake world' too many people have NO sense of humour, and are offended by just about everything; I believe that comedy is the last bastion of free speech and that's why we need people like Seth, Sarah and producer Alexandra Rushfield to slap us in the face with the irony of how crass and commercial the holiday season has become. This is a series aimed at those who recognize irony, and like dark humour-which I do. So 'Proceed with Caution'.

Handy Ice Melting Winter Tip

I came across this Handy Winter Tip and I am certanly going to try it on my own driveway as I can III afford to slip and fall.

Thankfully, winter-proofing your home doesn't require breaking the bank on rock salt or fancy gadgets. You can create a DIY de-icer with items you already own, according to Jeff Rossen, NBC News National Investigative Correspondent and host of Rossen Reports.

This magical ice melter is easy to make, too. In a bucket, combine a half-gallon of hot water, about six drops of dish soap, and 1/4 cup of rubbing alcohol. Once you pour the mixture onto your sidewalk or driveway, the snow and ice will begin to bubble up and melt. Just keep a shovel handy to scrape away any leftover pieces of ice.

Why does this simple combo work? Turns out, rubbing alcohol has a much lower freezing point than water, so it speeds up the melting process and prevent the surface from icing up in the future,
