For the most part when folks around this Island hear the name Natalie MacMaster they think of the whirling dervish with the flowing locks who completely commands the fiddle and the stage at the same time; with lots of hard work, extensive touring, determination, a genuine appreciation for her fans, and a down to earth/down home personality Natalie became a fiddling legend both here, and abroad. As the years went by Natalie and husband Donnell Leahy's status grew-and so did their family, with 7 musically gifted children. I have to admit something: I am not much of a fan of Cape Breton style fiddling, and I do know that we have a lot of incredibly talented fiddlers here-but it's not my cup of tea. I do however like Leahy's fiddling style, which is predominately rooted in Celtic and Country music. It must be a hard decision for Celtic fiddlers to make; do they stay the musical course they're on or do they explore new musical territories? Well, this is Natalie's third album



("Canvas") with Donnell and to be honest-they've hit a home run. For instance the track "Colour Theory" (featuring Brian Finnegan on tin whistle and flute) is a great tune that has an Irish influence, with daughter Mary Francis Leahy on piano. Other standout tracks include the fiery instrumentals "Galicia", a modern day Don Messer-style "Choo Choo", and the J Scott Skinner penned "East Neuk of Fife" and the hauntingly beautiful "The Laird O' Bemersyde" are amazing. There are traditional influences here, but the album also has an international flavour on a number of the tracks. Guest appearances also include Rhiannon Giddens on "Woman of the House", Yo-Yo Ma on "So You Love" and Robyn Cunningham on "Wish You Were Near". I honestly didn't know what to expect from this album but I will say that it offers the listener lots of variety from track to track; it is indeed a multi-coloured musical canvas.

Old Time Radio And Music Podcasts

This week's Old Time Radio Podcast is "The Whistler" and is available for download from ir website

"The Whistler" was an American radio program running for a total of 13 years from May 16, 1942 until September 22, 1955. It was one of the most popular mystery drama's of its' time. Signal Oil Company sponsored the program. The marketing catch phrase was: "Let that whistle be your signal for the Signal Oil program, The Whistler."



During the first two years of the show J. Donald Wilson was the writer and producer. During 1944 producer and director George Allen took over. Other directors included Sterling Tracy and Sherman Marks with final scripts by Joel Malone and Harold Swanton. 692 total episodes were produced. Over 200 of those episodes can not be found and are no longer in existence.

Episodes of The Whistler began with the ominous narration: I am the Whistler, and I know many things, for I walk by night. I know many strange tales, many secrets hidden in the hearts of men and women who have stepped into the shadows. I know the nameless terrors of which they dare not speak.



- TAX TIPS 2022 -**DISABILITY TAX CREDITS**

Living with a disability, whether mental or physical, can greatly affect your day-to-day life – especially financially. Often, disabled taxpayers have some unavoidable additional expenses that others don't have to face, and they can quickly add up. To offset these additional costs, Canadians with disabilities are offered some additional tax credits and deductions.

But what exactly are these tax benefits and how can you claim them come filing time?

WHAT IS THE DISABILITY TAX CREDIT? - Perhaps one of the most important credits for those living with a disability is the Disability tax credit (DTC) – a non-refundable tax credit that reduces the taxes owing by Canadians with severe and prolonged physical or mental impairments.

But why is it one of the most important? Because being eligible for the DTC not only allows you to claim a federal maximum of \$8,662 plus an additional supplement of up to \$5,053 for those under the age of 18 (for 2021), but it can open the door to other federal, provincial, or territorial programs. These include the disability component of the Canada workers benefit and the child disability benefit.

It also opens the door to the registered disability savings plan (RDSP). This tax-free savings plan is designed to help you prepare for the long-term financial security of someone who's eligible for the DTC. As of 2021, if the beneficiary becomes ineligible for the DTC, there's no longer a time limit for how long their RDSP will remain open.

If you're eligible for the federal DTC you can also claim the corresponding provincial/territorial tax credit. If you didn't claim these on previous returns, you can request an adjustment for up to 10 years.

In order to qualify for the DTC, you'll have to have a medical practitioner complete the Form T2201, Disability Tax Credit Certificate, certifying that you have an impairment and describing its effects on your life.

Keep in mind that you can claim the DTC amounts for yourself or a dependant with a disability. If you don't need the full credit to bring your tax owing to zero, you can also transfer it to your spouse or common-law partner, or another supporting person.

DISABILITY MEDICAL EXPENSES - In addition to the DTC, you're also able to claim medical expenses for certain medicines, devices and treatments. This includes expenses associated with having a service animal, accessible computer software, changes you made to your home or car to make it more accessible and also sign-language interpretation services.

Canada Housing Benefit Deadline

If you are a renter, you may qualify for this federal government \$500 Benefit. It is for low income renters and the deadline is March 31st. Get your application in before this deadline to ensure you get the \$500.

The one-time top-up to the Canada Housing Benefit aims to help low-income renters with the cost of renting. You may be eligible for a tax-free one-time payment of \$500 if your income and the amount that you pay on rent qualify. The program is still open.

The Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) administers this one-time payment.


To apply for this new federal one-time payment, you do not need to receive other housing benefits such as the Canada Housing Benefit, which is co-funded and delivered by the provinces and territories.

Applications are open until Friday, March 31, 2023
