



Have you ever watched a movie and afterwards thought 'what the hell was that'? "Nefarious" stars Jordan Belfi and Sean Patrick Flanery ("Boondock Saints") and tells the tale of a death row inmate, and the psychiatrist who is hired to prove that Flanery is sane so that he can be executed-as Flanery claims to be possessed by an ancient demon. Full disclosure; this movie was made by Believe Entertainment, a group that releases faith-based films that are not overly preachy-yet do promote Christian values. According to the film's co-director (Cary Soloman) the film had a troubled production. Soloman, a Catholic, said that many of the film's production issues were the results of demonic manifestations which included 8 car crashes, equipment and electrical failure, frequent fire alarms, and faulty cameras. A Catholic priest was present on set while the film was shooting and performed an exorcism on the film's set during production. Without getting bogged down in dogma the conversations between the 2 main actors is riveting, and Flanery's perfor-



mance is incredible. What follows is a historical debate of good vs evil and the origins of Satan, with many paradoxes and enigmas that would jar almost any person's beliefs, leaving more questions than answers. Even if a person doesn't consider themselves a 'religious' person, an atheist or agnostic the historical debate presented here is fascinating. There's a bit of a twist ending to the story-which only adds more to the mystique of this film. Michael John Petty (Collider website) said "it isn't perfect, but a great step for faith-based films" stating "Nefarious" rises above the general cliches associated with faith-based productions and stands out as something increasingly more interesting than its religious contemporaries." I totally agree.

ANNUAL LEAD AND COPPER SAMPLING PROGRAM FOR RESIDENTIAL TAP WATER

If you ever wondered about your tap water, now there is something you can do about it. The CBRM Water Utility is seeking volunteers for the annual lead and copper sampling program for residential tap water. The program is for customers of the CBRM Water Utility, not for those whose water source is a well.

The Water Utility routinely monitors water quality within distribution systems. In 2020, Nova Scotia Environment introduced additional sampling requirements for lead and copper within customers' homes.

This sampling program will be provided free of charge to a limited number of customers in each CBRM distribution system (Sydney, Glace Bay, Northside, New Waterford, Louisbourg, Floral Heights and Centreville).

Participants will be registered on a first come first serve basis until the program goals are met. The program occurs every year. Customers can sign up online: https://www.cbrm.ns.ca/water-utility

This water sampling will determine if lead and copper are present in customers' tap water and a results letter will be provided. Although lead and copper can occur naturally in the environment, a main source in drinking water is through leaching of plumbing materials such as pipes, solder, faucets, and fittings. While copper is an acceptable material for use in plumbing, lead is no longer an acceptable building material.

TAX TIPS & VALUABLE DEDUCTIONS

Attendant Care Expenses Paid to a Retirement Home

For seniors who are eligible to claim the disability amount, attendant care expenses paid to a retirement home may be claimed as a medical expense.

To claim this amount, a receipt must be provided from the retirement home, detailing the amount paid for attendant care. Eligible attendant care costs would include the salaries and wages of employees of the retirement home who provide the services of meal preparation, health care, housekeeping for the resident's individual living space, laundry service for the resident's personal laundry, transportation services, and security in secured units.

Rent expense and food costs cannot be included as medical expenses. If the above mentioned attendant care expenses are provided by the retirement home, but not invoiced separately, the home should be asked to provide a receipt which details the portion of the total payment which would reasonably apply as attendant care.

Please see the attendant care expenses article for information on how the attendant care expenses can be deducted, as the taxpayer has a choice in how it is done.

If a previous tax return has already been filed without this expense claimed, or you would like to request a reassessment for a prior year, see the article on changing your tax return.

If attendant care costs are paid to an individual, your receipt must include their social insurance number. The individual will either be a self-employed contractor, or your employee. If the individual is an employee, you will be required to deduct from their pay and remit income tax, CPP contributions, and EI premiums. You will also have to pay the employer portion of CPP contributions and EI premiums, which would be part of your total attendant care costs. The amounts that you pay to an employee are subject to the rules for minimum wages rates and other employment standards for your province or territory.
