



2016 TAX TIPS FROM CH ACCOUNTING & TAX

Top Five Commonly Overlooked Tax Tips

1. - MEDICAL EXPENSES: If you pay a healthcare premium through payroll deduction, this is considered a medical expense as well as any deductibles or out of pocket expenses that are not covered by your plan. If you purchase healthcare insurance to travel, this can also be claimed as a medical expense.

2 - DISABILITY TAX CREDIT: Many taxpayers feel they do not qualify but it may be worth asking your doctor to review the criteria on the T2201 medical disability form. This form is submitted to the CRA and they will determine whether you qualify.

3 - REPORT YOUR INCOME: Any child under 18 who works part or full time during the summer months may be entitled to a refund of taxes paid if their income is below the basic personal amount. Even if no tax is deducted, reporting the income will increase the child's RRSP contribution limit for future years.

4 - GET YOUR BENEFITS: Those turning 19 before April 1, 2018 should be filing a 2016 tax return even if they had no income. This will allow them to collect the GST/ HST credit for the quarter following their 19th birthday.

5 - DETERMINING DEPENDENTS - Even with people names, pets are NOT dependents . But if your parents live with you, are over 65 and have a relatively low income, you may be able to claim them as dependents

Depeche Mode – "Spirit" - It's impressive to see that Depeche Mode are still alive and kicking (no pun intended at the band Simple Minds); DM formed in 1980, released their first single and album in 1981 and after 37 years, 13 more albums (including this one),

very few line-up changes, drug and alcohol abuse and changing trends in the music business Depeche Mode has consistently defied the odds by releasing albums that

transcended fads and fashionall the while remaining relevant, topical and for the most p art-deep and meaningful. Much of their music was influenced by culture, religion and politicshowever, this is the band's darkest, most ominous, and timeliest album of all.

Last month, American white supremacist Richard Spencer (he prefers to be called an 'identitarian") described Depeche Mode as the official band of the 'alt-right movement' in the United States, implying that their music had a fascist element in it. That infuriated the band, and they subsequently used a 'blunt' curse word to publicly rebuke Spencer. As unfortunate as that was, the timing was perfect-the band was releasing this album-one that shines a light on a rotting global system.

As I alluded to earlier this is the band's fourteenth album, was released 2 weeks ago-and it is great. The band teased fans last month by releasing the first single, "Where's the Revolution" and what a tease it was. The song has a dark, ominous and political overtone that smacks of the upheaval and unrest all around us (think of Big Brother, "1984" or some people's views on Trump) and where it follows



the opening track called "Going Backwards" you quickly see and hear a tangible theme at play. That direction is further supported by the songs "The Worst Crime", the oh-so-1980's synth-laced

and incredible "Poorman" and the hard-hitting rhythmic track "Scum".

There are some nice surprises here; I could easily imagine The Weeknd singing "Poison Heart", a song with a brooding and smoky delivery and "So Much Love" really sounds like an Ian Curtis/Joy Division number-it's the best track here. The album closes out with, once again, a dark and foreboding track, "Fail", featuring a passionate plea for people to use common sense, and to wake up to the true realities around them before it's too lateto cut through what mass media, politicians and multi-nationals force feed us all every minute of every day. This album is a huge statement, not easy to absorb at first, and not something for all-but that's the way great art is sometimes.
